





Dear Resident:


As we move forward, in spite of the increase in cases in British Columbia, we have new protocols with respect to the quarantine of residents after exposure in the community.

The graph below shows that we are now experiencing the same daily new cases of COVID-19 that we did at the peak back in April/May. The second graph shows that we can attribute the increase in cases to a small percentage of our younger population who are not abiding by the social distancing guidelines and continue to congregate in large groups and frequent known COVID-19 hotspots.



Note that in British Columbia, we have effectively lost the ground that we had made with respect to controlling the spread of COVID-19. We are now at identical daily infection levels that we were at during the height of the pandemic in B.C. during March to May.

QUARANTINES:

14 Days

From this point forward, we will not be quarantining anyone who visits their doctor, eye doctor, dentist or specialist, as long as they have not made those visits at a hospital. The Provincial Health Authority order to impose a 14 day quarantine on anyone who has made a hospital visit shall remain in effect. This will also apply to anyone who travels outside of the province.

7 days

This means that the only activity that will result in a 7 day quarantine will be residents who go to a family members home for visits, BBQ's or travel to various destinations outside of the Greater Vancouver area. A longer quarantine period may be imposed by the Manager of Nursing and/or General Manager, depending on the nature of the visit. For example, attending a wedding or BBQ where a large group of people have gathered will result in a 14 day quarantine upon return, to protect the resident population from possible infection.

We still require that you provide us with information about your proposed journeys into the community so that we are able to provide the Public Health Authority with as much information as possible for "contact tracing", should you become infected with COVID-19 during one of your trips. We continue to ask that you do not go to restaurants, stores or visit with other members of the public on your excursions, for your own safety and the safety of others here at Harrison Pointe. The honour system will be used in determining quarantines in that regard. Please be respectful and cognizant of your time in the community. We value all of you and our staff.
